She attended the John Herron school of Art for two years then transferred to Manchester College. She graduated with an Art Education degree in 1980. She also made the best gravy EVER! While never mastering the ability to do a cartwheel or play competitive kickball, Dyanne always cheered the rest of us on.

Dyanne and Rick loved to work in their yard and garden together. She had many different types of flowers including over 40 varieties of daffodils of which she could recite both their common and scientific names.
