Alice F. Webb, 82, of Mentone, Indiana passed at 5:25 pm, Wednesday, Nov. 11, 2020 at Kosciusko Community Hospital of Warsaw, Indiana after complications of COVID-19.

Alice was born on Dec. 7, 1937 in Kewanna, Indiana to the late Fred and Grace (Henricks) Stingley. She married on April 20, 1956 in Kewanna to Richard C. Webb, he survives.

Alice was a graduate of Kewanna High School. She retired from DePuy Orthopedics of Warsaw in 2000 after 31 years. She was a member of the Mentone United Methodist Church as well as a member of the Jolly Janes Home Economics Club. She was known for her work with Mary & Jerry's Helping Hands.
