Chad Allan Study, 44, of Warsaw, Indiana passed at 10:48 am, Saturday, Oct. 3, 2020 at St. Vincent Hospital of Indianapolis, Indiana. He lived his life on his small farm in Warsaw and had a successful internet business for over 20 years.

Chad was born on March 10, 1976 in Melrose Park, Illinois to Al and Linda (Davidson) Study. Chad was a Warsaw High School graduate and attended Purdue University where he was a Teacher's Assistant in computer technology. While he was at Purdue, he bowled a 300 PBA accredited game.
