Nayomia Maple, 70, Akron, died at 2 a.m., Sunday, Dec. 15, 2013, at her residence after being in failing health for a year and a half.

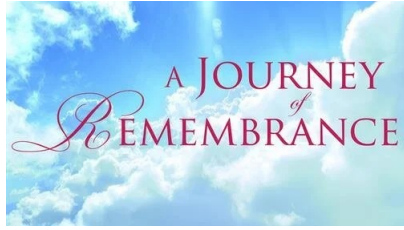
